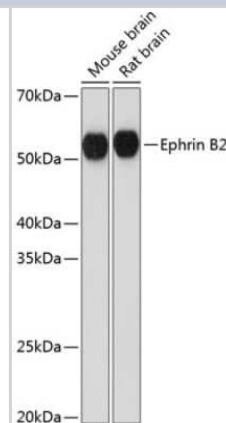

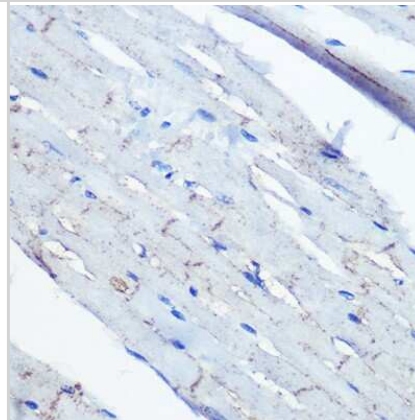

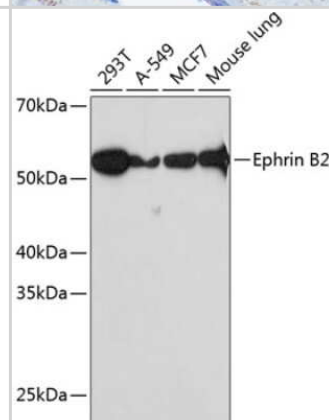

Secondary antibody: HRP Goat Anti-Rabbit IgG (H+L) at 1:10000 dilution. Lysates/proteins: 25ug per lane. Blocking buffer: 3% nonfat dry milk in TBST. Detection: ECL Basic Kit. Exposure time: 5s.



Immunohistochemistry-Paraffin: Ephrin-B2 Antibody (1G9E7) [NBP3-15372] - Immunohistochemistry of paraffin-embedded rat heart using Ephrin-B2 Rabbit mAb (NBP3-15372) at dilution of 1:100 (40x lens). Perform microwave antigen retrieval with 10 mM PBS buffer pH 7.2 before commencing with IHC staining protocol.
